EASTERN TOUR DISCOVERY TRIP REPORT

DATE: FEB 9TH-17TH 2018

Introduction:

This was a trip customized for five persons with intentions of designing new itineraries and discovering the rare birding route in the eastern part of the country since most bird watchers use the Western circuit that stretch from the central to the South up to the North. This particular trip covered the hot spots in the east; **Mountain Elgon National Park (Kapkwai Forest)**, **Sipi Falls**, **Pian-upe Game Reserve**, **Matheniko-Bokora Wildlife Reserve** and **Kidepo Valley National Park**. The weather was hot with lots of wind only with the exception of Mountain Elgon(kapkwai Side) which had a cool weather. The tour covered several habitats from forests in mountain Elgon, thickets, bushes, shrubs and flat plains with scenic views of the raised rocky areas that were eye catching with excellent panoramic views that will linger forever and ever....., the tour started and ended in Kampala. We recorded **268 species** of birds, **2** seen by only the tour leader, **5** heard and **16** mammal species.

Day 1 : 09th-FEB-2018 ,Travel to mbale for overnight.

At 2:30PM, **Herbert, Miriam, Desire, Tonny , Tina** and I(**prossy**) were ready to set off to mbale 228km East of kampala, where mountain Elgon is found. After the briefing we left amidst a heavy traffic that caused us a slight delay, picked up a few birds on the wires and marshes; **Broad-billed Roller, Yellow-billed Kite, Black-headed Heron, Woodland Kingfisher, Cattle Egrets** and **pie Kingfishers** and **little Egrets** at the River Nile bridge. Finally reached mbale for overnight.

Day 2: 10th -FEB-2018 , Travel to sipi Falls and mtn Elgon(Kapkwai recreation center)

After Breakfast, we left for sipi falls which took us an hour and twenty five minutes. Sipi lies at the edge of mountain Elgon near Kenya boarder in kapchorwa district north east of Sironko and Mbale Districts. Sipi has three main water falls with the longest drop pouring at hundred meters. One of the members



(miriam) had booked to do abseiling at Rob's Rolling Rock which was very exciting that another member from the group (Tina) got excited and joined for the activity. Its such a thrilling activity going down on ropes for a hundred meters and after hike back to the starting point.

Sipi falls

We picked out some nice birds as absailing was ongoing; **Nyanza swifts** kept flying around, stunning **Cinnamon-chested Bee-eater** nesting in the cliff, a soaring **Mountain Buzzard**, nicely parched male **Bronze Sunbird** which was joined by the female and later several individuals, unsatisfying views of two flying off **Red-winged Starling**, a big flock of soaring **White stork**, busy feeding **Olivaceous Warbler**, a flying off **Black-crowned Tchagra**, A pair of **African Fire Finch**, **Baglafecth Weaver**, and **African Thrush**.

Drove to the second water fall, this had breath taking views with a very cold natural pool at the bottom. The **Red-winged Starlings** were at our disposal to watch giving us all angles but the most pleasant was in flight where they display their red in the wings.

It was getting late so we had to leave for mtn Elgon '**Kapkwai recreation centre**' ,What a warm welcome, birds all over the place, a cool weather, Never expected this. We picked out some nice species before sunset; nice views of the **Cinnamon-chested Bee-eater** at our disposal, un ending calls of **Black faced-Rufous Warbler** which I gave a shout and a pair responded positively with nice looks, fantastic views of **Purple-throated Cuckoo-shrike** female, **Brown-capped Weaver** feeding on caterpillars in the trees, **Northern double collared Sunbird**, Un ending calls of **Narina Trogon**, **Mountain Oriole**, apair of **Black-nacked Weaver**, a loud call of the **Hertlaub's Turaco** which was not corperative at all, **Slender-billed Greenbul** feeding, several individuals of **African Thrush**, nicely displaying **Green-headed Sunbird**, **Luhder's Bush-shrike**, **Olivaceous Warbler**, several pairs of **Red-winged Starling** that kept flying over the canopy, **Dusky brown Flycatcher** and **African-blue Flycatcher** kept around all the time, **Yellow-whiskered Greenbul**, **Northern Puffback**, **Black Sunbird** gave us its time, a nesting pair of **Yellow white-eye**, a flock of **Bronze Mannikin**, **Klaas's cuckoo**, **Black-and-white Casqued Hornbill**, **Hairly-breasted Barbet**, **Black Sparrow hawk** and the **Pygmy Batis** that we viewed for five minutes. We retired for the day.

Overnight at kapkwai bandas

Day 3: 11th -FEB-2018 , Birding and travel to Mbale for overnight.

Mountain Elgon national park is a habitat to **300species** of birds of which **40 species** are restricted by range,56 of the **87 afrotropical** highland biome all live here.

Kapkwai recreational centre is **13km** from sipi town with several trails that can be used for visiting the caves, waterfalls , escarpments and bird watching in the forest.

The moning weather was good and birds were active, we Picked out a few species before breakfast; a couple of **Pink-footed Puffback**, Male **Purple throated Cuckooshrike**, sevaral idividuals of **Gray Apalis**, **Kandt's Waxbill**, **Semi-collared Flycatcher** nesting, more views of **Luhder's Bush-shrike** preening in the vains, **Brown-capped Weaver**, **Black-necked Weaver** seen again, a calling **Brown Illadopsis** which we never saw and the **Black Sparrow hawk** seen in flight.

Had breakfast and immediately left for a 3hour walk in the forest on such a well maintained trail.

A welcoming call of this thrush like songster at the start of the trail, only to look around was the **Abyssinian Ground Thrush** Parched high up in the canopy, **African hill Babbler**, **Scaly-throated Honeyguide** only heard, **Stuhlman's Starling** busy in a fruiting tree, **pygmy Batis** a rarely sighted species , a single **Grey-throated Barbet** lazily parched , **White-browed Combec**, **mountain wagtail** near a

stream, **Mountain Illadopsis** in the thick vines on the ground seen clearly by all the members, more satisfying views of **Mountain Oriole**, **African Thrush**, **Yellow Rumped Tinkerbird**, and **Narina Trogon**.

Drove to Kapchorwa for lunch, had a brief meeting with sipi falls guides and then back to Mbale for overnight. We scored the **Topical Boubou**, **Yellow-crowned Canary** and **Baglfetcht Weavers** en-route.

Overnight at visitors inn mbale.

Day 4: 12th-FEB-2018 , Shopping and travel to Pian-upe Game reserve.

Breakfast at 7:30am, shopping and medical checkup for one member who was not feeling well but fortunately the results were all negative, so we left to pian-upe Game reserve at 1:30pm birding all through. It was very hot and all grasses dry but birds were available all through. Started with **Lesser Kestrel** perched 5meters off the road, **Eastern-chanting Goshawk**, flocks of **Shelly's Rufous sparrow**, the wires provided good looks at the **Greater** and **Fox Kestrels**, various pairs of **Namaqua Dove** all over the fields and around homes, **Chestnut Sparrow weaver** was also very common, had un satisfying views of **Cut-throat Finch**, life was Kabutogoi River where several birds were around feeding, preening, drinking and taking a bathe at the river;1 adult and 2 young **Malachite Kingfishers** fishing in the river, **pieb Kingfisher**, three **Bar-breasted Firefinch** taking a bathe, **Spectacled Weavers**, **Village weavers**, and **Dark capped Bulbul**.

Common Sandpiper and **banded Martins** were seen at some of the swampy areas, **Vinaceous Doves** were also plentiful as the **Laughing Doves**, A flock of about 120 individuals of **Gray-crowned Cranes** , **Hamerkop**, and **speckled Mousebirds**.

We arrived at 4:30pm , laid out our tents and headed out for birding. The wind was strong making it hard for photography. We were rewarded with Two **ostriches** on arrival, **Blue-napped Mousebird**, a pair of **Stone Partridge** on the rock near the camping ground, **Sulphur-breasted Bush-shrike**, **Common Rock Thrush** in a full breeding Plumage, **Red Fronted Tinkerbird** feeding in one of the fig trees at the sight, **Eurasian Wryneck** single individual, pairs of **Spot-flanked Barbet**, **Pale Flycatcher** and **Silverbird** were all over the place.

On the evening game drive, we managed to score **Pied Wheatear**, **Whinchat**, **Greater-blue Eared Starling**, a pair of **Clarpperton's Francolin**, a single individual of **Standard-winged Nightjar**, a second one, third and later became a song of the game drive. What a successful day.

Day 5: 13th -Feb-2018 ,Early morning game drive and transfer to Moroto for overnight.

Pian-upe Game reserve is the biggest protected area with 2,788sqkm and is one of Uganda's untapped wilderness with plenty of birds and wildlife to see.

Had breakfast at 7:00am and left immediately for a morning game drive. Our first encounter was eleven individuals of **White-crested Helmet Shrike**, two pairs of **Wattled Starling**, very fast running pair of **Common Ostrich male**, **Grey Woodpeckers**, Herds of **Roan antelopes**, **L'owel's Hartebeest**, had an encounter of three **Cheetahs** moving away from a kill leaving **Lappet-faced Vultures** on the carcass,

Other Mammals encountered were **Chanler's Mountain Reedbuck**, **Topi**, **Deffassa Water buck** and **Common warthog**.

Had lunch at the camp and left for Moroto at 1:30pm. Views of Mtn Kadam was amazing, different communities of Karamajongs in their homestays (manyatas) was very impressive. As we drove through the villages, we had several encounters of nice birds; **Beudouin's Snake-Eagle**, **Fan-tailed Raven** and **Booted Snake-Eagle** soaring in the Sky, **Abyssinian Roller** displaying its beauties on the road side, **African black-headed Oriole** only heard, **Pied Wheatear** in a full breeding plumage, Female **Hunter's Sunbird** feeding on one of the flowering tree together with **Eastern Violet-backed Sunbird**. Had a very productive stopover the high way to Moroto that got us **Red-fronted Barbet**, **Slate-coloured Boubou**, **Black-throated Barbet**, **Red-headed Weaver**, three pairs of **White-bellied Go-away Bird**, **Spotted Morning Thrush** and **Rufous-crowned Roller**.

Day 6: 14th-FEB-2018 ,Birding Matheniko-Bokora Wildlife reserve

Matheniko-Bokora Wildlife Reserve is a part of the corridor of protected areas in Karamoja region whose Northeastern boundary is Uganda-Kenya Border with a total land area of 1,520sqkm. This makes it one of Uganda's hottest savanna spots for bird watching since it shares the same biome with North western Kenya.

Left Moroto with packed lunch at 8:00am to the park offices to pick up a ranger for the day. It was very productive that before we reached the reserve, birds were plenty to watch;

Started with **Red-naked Falcon** in less than a kilometer from Moroto town, **Lesser-blue Eared Starling** and **Greater Blue Eared Starling** in the same flock, **White-headed Buffalo Weavers** were all over the shrubs, four **Bronze Tailed Starlings**, a flock of **Yellow-rumped Seed-eater** together with **Cut-throat**

Finch, **Eastern Paradise Whydah** in Non breeding Plumage and **White-bellied Canary** feeding together, several pairs of **White-billed Buffalo Weavers** and **White-browed Sparrow Weavers**, a single individual of **Yellow-breasted Apalis**, **Northern Crombec**, **African grey Flycatcher**, **Little Bee-eater**, **Green Wood-hoopoe**, more views of **Black throated Barbet**, five **Red-billed Hornbills**, six **Dark Chanting Goshawks**, **Long -crested Eagle**, thirteen **Superb starlings**, four pairs of **d'Arnaud's Barbet**, a stunning pair of the tinny **Mouse-coloured Penduline Tit**, acceptable views of **Yellow-bellied Eremomera**, **African Gray Hornbill**, and retired with **Northern White-crowned Shrike**. What a day?.

Day 7: 15th-FEB-2018 , Birding to Kidepo valley National Park.

The road through Matheniko-Bokora wildlife reserve was very productive with several encounters of many birds seen the previous day and crazy moments of the **Purple Grenadier** two females which flew off to the bushes, we followed them and got a flock of two males and three females with a pair of **Blue-headed Cordon-bleu** and three **Rufous-tailed Scrub Robin**, had a flying off **Montague's Harrier**, **Tawny Eagle**, and nicely patched **Gabar Goshawk**. Looking forward to a long day to the park, we minimized birding but scooped out **Buff-crested Bustard** and **Abyssinian Scimitarbill** and **Pygmy Falcon** one of the very rare sightings in the region and Uganda as a whole.

Arrived at gate (Kidepo Valley National Park) at 4:12pm and won ourselves **Pallid Harrier**, A pair of **Montague's Harrier**, one **Red-billed Oxpecker** in a herd of **African Buffalos**, three individuals of **Clerpperton's Francolin** on the road side, five **White-backed Vulture** and two **Ruppell's Griffon Vulture**, and **Eurasian Hoopoe** a resident at Apoka Bandas where we had our night.

Mammals sighted; **Rock Hyrax** on the lion rock, **Deffassa Waterbuck**, African **Elephant**, a big Herd of **African Buffalos**, and **Common Jackal**.

Overnight at UWA Bandas.

Day 8: 16th-FEB-2018 , Morning game drive and travel to Kitigum.

Kidepo valley national park is one of Uganda's IBAs in the Somali-Masai biome with 480 species of birds second after Queen Elizabeth National Park in bird diversity. It is a habitat to 80 species of mammals with 28 of these not found anywhere on Uganda.

Morning breakfast was followed by a nice short game drive. Though we did not reach the birding zone/area, we got some nice species; **Ross's Turaco**, **Heuglin's Wheatear** in plenty, **Wing-snapping Cisticola**, **Red-pate Cisticola**, **Black-headed Batis**, more views of **Sulphur-breasted Bush-shrike**, **African Grey Hornbill**, **Northern Black Flycatcher**, **Grey-headed Bush-shrike**, **Long-billed Pipit**, a pair of **Yellow-billed Shrike** and later.... a flock, **Abyssinian Ground Hornbill**, **Little and Cattle Egrets** in the Swamp with **African Buffalos** herds, **Daffassa Waterbucks**. Other mammal encounters were of **Common Jackal**, **African Elephant**, **Vervet Monkey**, **Rothschild's Giraffe**, **L'owel's Hartebeests**, **Burchell Zebra**, **Oribi**, **Common Warthog**, **Patas Monkey**, and **olive Baboon**.

Had lunch and left for Kitigum for overnight. We picked out a few species; **Black Crake**, **African Jacana**, **Gambaga Flycatcher** seen only by the tour leader nice views of a flock of **white Crested Helmet-shrike**.

Day 9: 17th-FEB-2018 , Travel to Kampala.

Picked up some new species for the trip; **Grey-headed Kingfisher**, **Shikra**, **Stripped Kingfisher**, and **Western-banded Snake-eagle**.

What a successful trip! Thanks to members for being cooperative and patient at all times. You made the trip very successful together with the UWA rangers we worked with.
